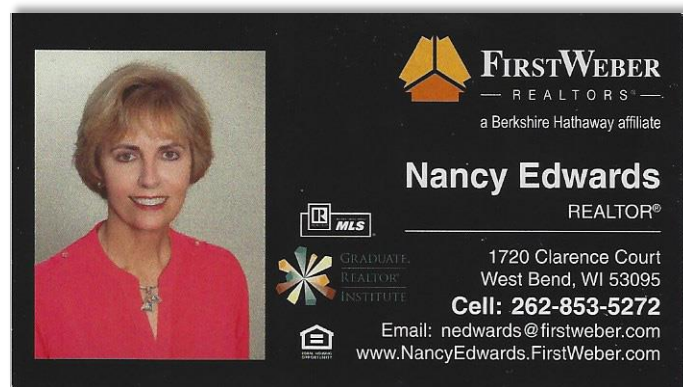
Now, I'm going to borrow from Gerry's December editorial and reiterate what he said then.

BOARD (GENERAL MEMBERSHIP) MEETING MINUTES January 12, 2023

CALL TO ORDER: Bruce P @ 6:01pm.

SECRETARY REPORT/REVIEW AND ACCEPTANCE OF PRIOR MEETING MINUTES: Nov 2022 minutes were reviewed and approved.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Rich shared the current status of the 2022 Balance Sheet showing income and expenses to date for 2022. Treasurer's Report Approved.

MEMBERSHIP: Ron G and Jim N shared this task as we moved from 2022 into 2023. We modified what we do so that we shared with each member the information we have in our database from last year's renewal, along with any additions and changes throughout the year. This way member didn't have to fill in a blank form. Feedback on this? (Favorable) Everyone caught the fact we save birthdays and anniversaries as just mm/yy with all occurring in 1999. Jim explained that this allows Newsletter person to do a much simpler search for upcoming birthdays and anniversaries for the newsletter.

Two different renewal forms were used, one for joint memberships and one for individual memberships. The individual form had room for members to convert to a joint membership and some did. We got a little out of sync when Pat updated the password before the renewal cycle was complete. This added a little complexity but as most renewals were in; it was really making sure that passcode only went to renewed members. At that point 22 had not yet completed renewals. As of tonight, only 12 remain. Likely only a handful of them will actually renew. Decided tonight, after 2/28/2023 any former members will have to rejoin as new members at the new member rate.

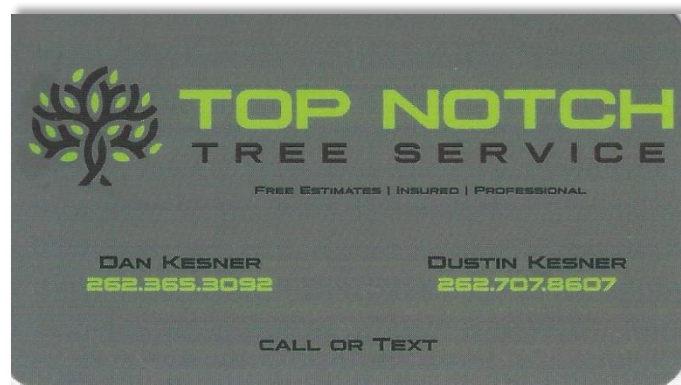
