## Non-Member Participation and Waiver Agreement

By entering into agreement, the Participant agrees to the following terms:

- 1. The participant must drive a Corvette in the event.
- 2. The participant must have valid U.S. Driver's License and the vehicle must have valid, in force minimum insurance as established by the State of Wisconsin at the time of the event.
- 3. The Participant agrees that their participation in the event is voluntary. Furthermore, the Participant agrees to assume any risk associated with participating in the event, and releases OCC and its members from any and all claims of loss or damage that may arise during the event. Such releases are without limitation, and include attorneys' fees, personal injury, property damage, and any other losses or damages suffered by the Participant.
- 4. The Participant agrees to indemnify and hold OCC and its members harmless against any and all claims of loss or damage, (including damage to OCC property) caused by the Participant.
- 5. If the event described below is a parade, the Participant agrees to abide by the OCC Parade Etiquette guidelines printed on the reverse side of this agreement.
- 6. OCC maintains the right to deny the Participant's participation in the event if they deem that participation would risk loss or damage to any party.
- 7. This Participation and Waiver Agreement shall be governed by the laws of Wisconsin. Any legal proceeding, claim, or lawsuit related to this agreement shall take place exclusively in courts located in Ozaukee County, Wisconsin.
- 8. Participant agrees to pay a \$10.00 participation fee at the time of the event. The fee may be credited to a new membership fee in the event the Participant chooses to join OCC as a regular member.
- 9. This is a one-time Agreement and is valid only to the event described below.

## **Ozaukee Corvette Club Parade Etiquette**

For the benefit of each member, we ask that you operate your Corvette in a safe manner, and follow these rules of good conduct and common sense.

- 1. Law Enforcement Please follow the instructions and directives of all law enforcement officers at our parades.
- 2. Throwing Items Please do NOT thrown any items from your Corvettes to the spectators, such as candy. We've seen children run into the street in front of our cars to pick up candy from the pavement. Be aware of everything and everyone around you during the parade.
- 3. Discourage People from Approaching Your Car While we encourage waving to the crowd, we discourage spectators from approaching our cars for a "high five" or a handshake. If someone does approach your car, stop immediately, and politely ask them to return to the side of the road.
- 4. Burnouts, Hot Dogging, and Rapid Acceleration Parade speed is usually 1-3 mph. You are in close proximity to your fellow OCC members and the parade spectators. Doing a burnout or accelerating up on the car ahead of you is prohibited. You will be asked to leave the parade and you may be ticketed for reckless driving.
- 5. Revving Your Engine The crowd may ask you to "Rev It Up". You may do this at your own peril, but be aware of law enforcement's wishes and remember the crowd will not be taking up a collection for a blown engine, clutch, transmission, etc.
- 6. Parading If you are not experienced or are new to parading, you may want to consider falling in at the end of the parade until you feel confident operating your Corvette in close proximity to others.
- 7. Guests and Non-Members Guests are always welcome to ride as passengers.
