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
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March 2017 Tech Tip – Waking The Beast.

This is an older tech tip published about 7 years ago. I have added some things concerning zinc in motor oil, and tire stress checking. These issues have become more relavant since this tech tip was originally written.


Spring, glorious Spring! Our thoughts go to getting our cars on the road for another season of the best motoring in the world! Nothing quite like a Corvette, and the thrill of the open road. Many of us have our own time tested methods to prepare our Corvettes for the road after a winter of storage. This tech tip is given in the spirit of helping those that may need a Corvette spring wake-up plan, and perhaps adding a few helpful tips to your established routine.


The thing we need to remember is to be cautious, and never assume everything will work the same as it did last fall when we prepared our cars for a long winter's nap. When you initially approach your Corvette, do a thorough visual inspection of the floor under your car. You are looking for oil and coolant pools, and possibly signs of a nest that some industrious mouse of squirrel built in your engine bay or on top of your rear end assembly. Also, be aware that there could freeze plugs laying on your garage floor because your anti-freeze didn't do its job. (BTW, if you see freeze plugs, you are probably going to be looking for a new motor, because your engine block is probably cracked internally). Check all fluid levels, and change your oil and filter if you didn't do it last fall. Some owners may change their engine oil again even after changing it last fall. Some techs will tell you, that even though your Corvette has not been driven, acids and water, from condensation, will still form in the oil. Starting your car during the winter and allowing it to come up to operating temp is great for the electrical system, the cooling system, and the transmission; however, acids form faster in the oil when the engine has been operated. Remember, new oil and a filter are the most inexpensive insurance you can buy for your Corvette. There is one new caution for those of you with pre-1980 Corvettes. If your Corvette does not have "roller lifters" like all the cars built after 1980, your small block or big block Chevy is equipped with "flat tappet" lifters. These flat tappet lifters ride directly on the camshaft without the low friction benefit of a roller wheel. The problem is the current motor oils. Over the past few years, all the car manufacturers have asked the oil companies to dramatically reduce or eliminate "Zinc" from their oils. It seems that zinc in motor oils is responsible for the failure of cat converters on many new cars. The car companies have to warranty all failed cat converters on any car with less than 50,000 miles. The real problem for those of you with older Corvettes is, the lack of zinc is causing the failure of camshafts and lifters. The oil is not lubricating as well. The tech tip, is to buy oils that have added zinc or ZDDP additive. Joe Gibbs Racing sells guart bottles of "ZDDP enhanced oils" in a variety of viscosities. There are other brands of oil that are also raising the zinc levels to protect older car's cam and lifters. This is also very crutial on freshly rebuilt engines using common flat tappet hydraulic or solid lifters for proper cam break-in.

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
Before starting the car, check all fluid levels- oil, coolant, transmission, brake fluid, hydraulic clutch (C-4, C-5, C-6), and rear end/ differential fluid level. Look for those rodent nests in the air cleaner, cowl area, front suspension, or intake manifold/ plenum. It is possible that a nest can catch on fire, and cause a fatal under hood fire. Check the fluid level in the battery (you can pop the covers off maintenance free batteries). If the battery is low, add distilled water only. The chemicals in tap water can hurt batteries. If voltage is less than 9 volts, the starter will by-pass and not allow the engine crank. The reason for that "fluttering" sound is the car protecting itself. Ask our resident electricians, Ron Giese, Frank Gilitzer, or George Jurss when voltage drops and amperage increases, how that can damage delicate electronic circuits in the Corvettes computer. Put a charger on the car at a low setting (10 amp) and allow several hours for the car to charge. Those of you with 1999 and newer Corvettes, with original equipment battery, be advised that you may have an AGM (Absorbed Glass Mat) battery. The AGM battery needs to be charged at a voltage less than 15 volts. This is extremely important, or you will damage your battery. Speaking of brake fluid, open the system cap and look at the color of the fluid. If it is clear, and resembles "Ginger Ale" in color, everything is good. (Continued next page)



However, if it is dark amber or looking like the color of "root beer" you should definitely consider replacing the fluid. Brake fluid absorbs moisture, and turns dark as the moisture level builds in the fluid. This can cause corrosion inside the ABS control unit and the brake lines.

Once your Corvette is running, inspect the underside for fluid leakage, and under the hood for fuel leaking at the injectors, fuel line fittings, or fuel pressure regulator. If any fuel or liquid is found leaking- do not drive your car under any circumstances until the source of the leak is found and repaired. The tech tip is to have your car towed to your tech's repair shop. (The good news is, towing insurance will usually cover the cost of the tow. Look for cracks and/ or bulges in all the rubber coolant hoses. Snug up all hose clamps- but not too tight. Inspect the tires for cuts, bulging and stress checking on the side walls and tread. If you find any of those little cracks in the rubber sidewalls or tread area, do not drive on those tires, they will fail and need to be replaced. Check tire air pressure, and set to recommended levels. While idling, and warming up, operate the clutch and brake pedals and be certain the clutch can be fully disengaged. Be certain the brake pedal doesn't go to the floor, and that the pedal travel is not excessive. If excessive brake pedal travel or depressing the clutch pedal(on C-4 thru C-7) does not allow engagement of the manual transmission gears, these systems may have air in the lines and need to be bled. Older Corvettes with mechanical lever clutch systems should also be serviced if the clutch will not disengage and allow you to put the car in gear.

Once everything is checked and warmed up, take your car out and drive it very gently, to be certain everything is running and shifting well. Once you are confident, everything is working as it should, enjoy your car as it was designed and have a great season of driving America's finest car.
